6.1 VP Communications and Administration- Appendix F

- Voting will be next meeting. Discussion has been going on since commissioner positions were created. VP Internal should be dealing more with events; a new executive should be dealing with documents specifically.
- Question: What is the point in VP Internal?

- Answer: Realistically, events are most of the VP internal's portfolio already, and hasn't been handling documents recently anyway.
- Question: Would commissioners under VP internal change?
- Answer: It will depend on the specific VP internal.
- People who run for VP I tend to be focused on events rather than documents
- Question: Are we creating a position that doesn't do anything?
- Answer: No, we already have a communications commissioner who does a lot, it is changing this position to a higher level of accountability.
- Question: What is the difference between VP Internal and VP operations?
- The term that VP operations existed was as a trail, they were in charge of services rather than events
- Question: Will there be someone to fill this role?
- Answer: Yes, 3-5 people apply for commissioner of communication each term already
- Question: Has there been a trail of having commissioner of communication do this and test the work load?
- Answer: Yes for the majority of the work involved.
- Question: How will this increase the workload of communications commissioner?
- Answer: Role of communications commissioner is increasing, and warrants a VP position already.
- Question: Will there be a VP CA in the elections upcoming this term?
- Answer: VP CA would be included in the next election
- Question: If it is not structured well enough beforehand, it will cause problems in the election, such as the past VP operations candidate running against VP internal candidate.
- Answer: This is a different case as there are two different roles rather than one or the other
- Comment: Short amount of time for someone to prepare
- Question: What kind of growth is there for VP CA as the work seems very simple and clerical?
- Answer: Any VP role would look like that on the very basic level; however creating an effective strategy would cause the work to be more meaningful and to include growth.
- Question: It sounds like we're creating VP Events and VP internal rather than VP CA and VP Internal. Naming seems wrong
- Answer: VP Internal also manages services which is why they are named that way but the names aren't overly important.
- Question: What happens if B soc shuts this down next term and we have an elected VP that isn't official?
- Answer: B soc exec fully supports it, and even if it does fail, the only change that will be caused will be that they don't actually have a vote in council.
