1.0 Welcome and Call to Order

2.0 [D] Approval of Meeting Minutes

• *Motion:* Approve the minutes

3.0 [D] Textbook library closure plan

- Reading of the motion by Chair
- Speaking to motion: Leila Meema-Coleman
 - The goal of this motion is to close the EngSoc textbook library, for reasons including
 - Lack of student engagement and use of the service
 - Lack of funds to run the library
 - The fact that all services provided by the library are replicated outside of campus
 - o It is important to understand that EngSoc will not be profiting in any way from the closure of the library
 - o The closure plan is as follows
 - The inventory will be divided in half, with each one half being appropriated to ASoc, and one half being appropriated to BSoc
 - Half of the books will be available for ASoc Sale



- The other half of the inventory and leftover inventory from the ASoc sale will then be sold on BSoc next term
- All profits from these sales will be donated to charity
- This proposal was discussed by both presidents and the business manager. All that remains is for board to approve this plan.

4.0 [I] Actuals Update

- *Speaking to Motion:* Kevin McNamara
 - In order for the budget to be finalized, and as required by the governing documents, Board must approve annual EngSoc budgets as well as actuals to ensure transparency and provide fiscal oversight
 - The corporate account is budgeting a deficit this term, but this is to be expected
 - BSoc has paid in its last contribution into the corporate account over the term
 - o Novelties sales were slower than what we have projected
 - We have more sponsorship income than what was expected for the term
 - o Renovations for the term were slightly over budget
 - The photocopying bill was incurred due to the previous ASoc term's marketing
 - It is projected that EngSoc will run a deficit for this term, but the influx of student fees over the Fall 2015 term will remedy the deficit
 - o *Question:* Does the \$975 from Ridgidware include all expenses?
 - Yes. This is pure income
 - Over 8 months, Ridgidware ran \$1300 in sales, on a \$1000 initial investment, and they still have inventory
 - o However, the C & D lost money over last term
 - This is part of a trend starting last year
 - Changes are being made to boost C & D profits, contact Kevin for more details
 - Next meeting, we will see the updated actuals

5.0: [D] Adding vendors to the Vendor List

 - As per the new governing documents, this is the new process for EngSoc fee increases
 - It is a good practice to increase the EngSoc student fee by the Consumer Price Index every year, in order to account for inflation, and ensure that EngSoc revenues have the same buying power year over year.
 - The fee has been rounded up to \$15.75 in order to be rounded to the nearest 5 cents. This makes life easier for student refunds
 - Upon approval, this motion will go to the university Board of Governors for final approval, and then the fee will show up on the students' bills.
